Pontius Pilate presiding over the trial of Jesus asked, "What then shall I do with Jesus who is called Christ?" He asked the right question, but gave the wrong answer.

I. Events Before the Trial.

- A. The antagonism to Jesus. John 11:53-57
 - 1. Pharisees because He challenged their teaching.
 - 2. Sadducees because He exposed their rackets.
 - 3. Herodians because He threatened their power base.
- B. The adulation of Jesus. John 12:1-19
 - 1. The resurrection of Lazarus.
 - 2. The triumphal entry into Jerusalem.
- C. The arrest of Jesus. John 18:2-11
 - 1. The treachery of Judas.
 - 2. The dignity of Jesus.
- D. The arraignment of Jesus.
 - 1. Before Annas no witness to start proceedings. John 18:12f
 - 2. Before Caiaphas and Sanhedrin. Matthew 26:57f
 - a. Illegal procedures.
- b. "Guilt" established.
- c. Sentence passed.
- d. Pilate's permission required.

II. Jesus Before Pilate.

- A. Pilate's dilemma.
 - 1. Politically, he was unpopular with both Jerusalem and Rome.
 - 2. Personally, his wife told him to have nothing to do with Jesus.
 - 3. Professionally, he had to administer justice and maintain law and order.
 - 4. Privately, he was intrigued with Jesus.
- B. Pilate's discovery.
 - 1. Jesus was the King of a kingdom "not of this world."
 - 2. Jesus was the embodiment of "Truth."
 - 3. Jesus claimed to be "the Son of God."
- C. Pilate's dodges.
 - 1. Jesus is not my issue "take him yourselves and judge him."
 - 2. Someone else can decide "He sent him to Herod." Luke 23:7
 - 3. Maybe I can compromise so I don't have to decide Barabbas.
 - 4. I'll deny Him and declare myself innocent "washed his hands."
- D. Pilate's downfall.
