 - a. Commitment to meeting social needs...
 - b. ...in the context of prayer and anointing. 6:6
 - 2. "Full of faith and the Holy Spirit" believing and trusting. 6:5
 - a. Insight into the eternity Jesus at the right hand of God. 7:55
 - b. Confidence in the face of death. 7:59
 - 3. "Full of God's grace and power" "sweetness and strength." 6:8
 - a. Sweetness in a dying prayer for his murderers. 7:60
 - b. Strength in a confrontational exposure of sin. 7:51

- B. The authentication of his ministry to the skeptical.
- C. The application to the contemporary church. Matthew 5:16; 1 Peter 2:12

IV. A Man Whose Words Were Irresistible. 6:10

- A. The accusation. 6:11-14
 - Partially right.
 Totally wrong.
- B. The "apologia." 7:2-53
 - 1. God is never limited to a place e.g. Abram, Joseph, Moses, Solomon.
 - 2. Law and Temple being superceded by Christ Whom you rejected.
- C. The action.
 - 1. The execution of the first martyr.
 - 2. The introduction of Saul of Tarsus. 7:58; 8:1; 22:20
 - 3. The expansion of the church. 8:1
