It is ironic that a "growing vanguard of society perceives what Christianity calls the 'good life' to be a threat to self-fulfillment" (Carl F.H. Henry) because God made people to be fulfilled, and only He can make it happen.

I. Fulfillment Through Purposefulness. vv. 9, 10a

- A. The knowledge of God's will.
 - 1. Full knowledge "Epignosis."
 - 2. Filled with this knowledge.
 - 3. Applied through spiritual wisdom and understanding.
- B. A life worthy of the Lord.
 - 1. Live a life walking.
 - 2. Worthily remembering your status before Him.
- C. Pleasing Him in every way.
 - 1. Desire to please. 2. The One to please.

II. Fulfillment Through Fruitfulness. v. 10b

- A. Fruitfulness as productivity.
 - 1. External evidence of internal life.
 - 2. Good works as evidence of true faith.
- B. Fruitfulness as progress.
 - 1. Progressive discovery of God.
 - 2. Progressive devotion to God.

III. Fulfillment Through Powerfulness. v. 11

- A. The extent of power.
 - 1. Strengthened with all power.
 - 2. According to His glorious might.
- B. The expression of power.
 - 1. The power of endurance response to circumstances.
 - 2. The power of patience restraint of self.
 - 3. The power of joy not stoic but Christian.

IV. Fulfillment Through Thankfulness. vv. 12-14

- A. Thankfulness for qualification.
 - 1. To enjoy inheritance.
 - 2. To be a saint in light.
- B. Thankfulness for emancipation.
 - 1. Rescue operation.
 - 2. Dominion of darkness.
- C. Thankfulness for situation.
 - 1. Member of the kingdom.
 - 2. King is "Son he loves."
- D. Thankfulness for redemption.
 - 1. Freedom from sin's power.
 - 2. Forgiveness of sin's record.
 - 3. Remembrance of redemption's cost.
