I. The Magnificence of King Jesus.

- A. Magnificent in the creation.
 - 1. "Image of the invisible God." v. 15a
 - a. Creation man in God's image. Genesis 1:26f
 - b. Incarnation Christ the image of God.
 - c. Regeneration man restored. 2 Corinthians 3:18; Romans 8:29
 - 2. "Firstborn over all creation." v. 15b
 - a. Not the first created being. See vv. 16, 17
 - b. Firstborn = heir of all things. See Hebrews 1:1, 2
 - 3. "By Him all things were created." v. 16
 - a. "In Him" the sphere of creation.
 - b. "Through Him" the agent of creation.
 - c. "For Him" the goal of creation.
 - 4. "He is before all things." v. 17a
 - a. His prior existence. See John 1:1 b. His superior status.
 - 5. "In Him all things hold together." v. 17b
 - a. He maintains and sustains. b. He is the unifying factor.
- B. Magnificent in the Church.
 - 1. "The Head of the Body." v. 18a
 - a. He controls.
- b. He coordinates.
- 2. "The beginning and firstborn from the dead." v. 18b
 - a. Supreme conqueror of death.
 - b. Beginning of newness of life.
 - c. Risen living dynamic of the church.
- 3. "In everything...Supremacy." v. 18c
- C. Magnificent in the Christian.
 - 1. "All His fullness dwelt in Him." v. 19
 - a. Incarnation.
 - b. Gnostic idea of "fullness" totality of emanations?
 - c. Christ the sole and sufficient Mediator.
 - 2. "Through Him to reconcile." v. 20a
 - a. Reconciliation.
 - b. God's initiative for a fallen world.
 - c. Christ's ministry of restoration.
 - 3. "Through His blood..." v. 20b
 - a. Redemption.
- b. Harmony of all things.
- c. Eventual fulfillment.

II. The Significance of King Jesus.

- A. Head of creation and church.
 - 1. No dichotomy between material and spiritual.
 - 2. He is Lord of "sacred" and "secular."
- B. He is supreme and sufficient.
 - 1. He creates and controls the universe.
 - 2. So He can support and supply His people.
- C. He is unifying and unique.
 - 1. We add nothing to Him. 2. We keep nothing from Him.
