I. The Place of Daily Devotions.

- A. Starting the day with the right attitude—"I will awaken the dawn." Psalm 108:1-5
 - 1. Gratitude for the past.
 - 2. Confidence for the future.
- B. Living the day with an expectant spirit—"I wait in expectation." Psalm 5:2-3
 - 1. You have dedicated it.
 - 2. He will direct it.
- C. Ending the day with a sober assessment—"I will lie down in peace." Psalm 4:8
 - 1. Tidy your spiritual desk.
 - 2. Take out your spiritual garbage.

II. The Practice of Daily Devotions.

- A. The development of spontaneous devotion.
 - 1. Recognizing God in created things. Romans 1:19-21
 - a. "Look at the birds." Matthew 6:26
 - b. "See how the lilies grow." Matthew 6:28
 - 2. Rejoicing in the Lord in common things.

 - 1. The place of discipline in discipleship.
 - a. Acknowledging the need to "lift up my eyes."
 - b. Balancing the pressures of a demanding lifestyle.
 - c. Countering the world, the flesh and the devil.
 - d. Desiring the conscious enjoyment of the Lord's presence.
 - 2. The need for structure in devotional life.
 - a. Developing a sense of devotion.
 - b. Developing a system of devotions.
